Recycling programs have expanded very slowly in the state and the ones in place appear to have many gaps. For example, my town participates in the single stream program. However, it refuses to handle many types of recyclable materials and the pick up is only once every two weeks.

The state needs to provide the leadership for the towns. We should fully fund DEEP and allow it to execute specific programs with tangible results.

I live in one of the Superfund sites that has yet to be remediated. Through a series of local inaction and years of denial, my town has ignored its problems with impunity. At this point, without strong intervention from the state, I do not see the town leadership as capable of taking any positive action.
