I strongly support the concept and the fund, however I do have concerns about a buyers conveyance fee. As an active real estate attorney conducting real estate closings every day here in Connecticut, I know first hand that the real estate market in many parts of our state is still quite soft and a buyers conveyance tax would create additional pressure and cost especially for lower income first time homebuyers buying in places like Manchester. In the aggregate, this could have a negative effect on the real estate market, which is an important piece of the overall health of the economy. I am reluctant to endorse additional fees or taxes that affect working class or middle class taxpayers, therefore I would not support a buyers conveyance fee on most residential purchases. I would like to either find another revenue stream or perhaps limit it to purchases over a certain amount (perhaps \$800,000, which is a threshold for the current seller conveyance tax) or to nonresidential or unimproved land. I would be happy to speak to CLCV further on this subject.
